His wife, Florinda, died of cancer at age 44 in May last year.

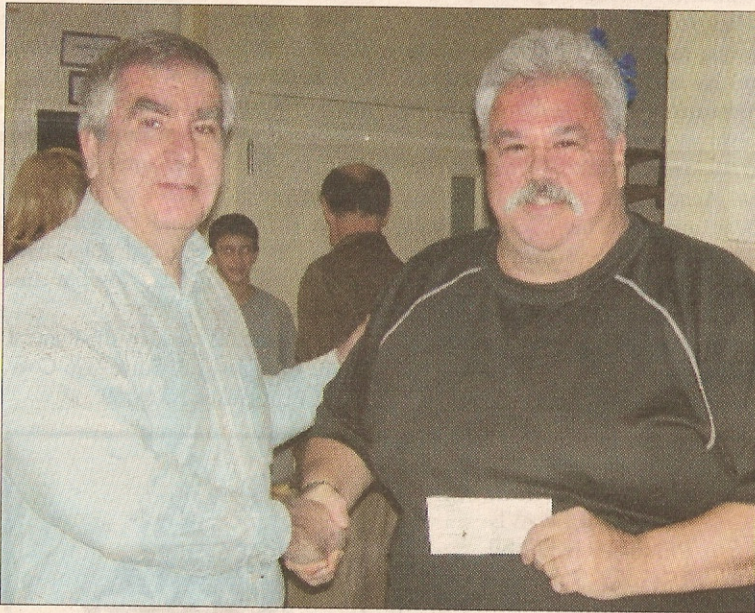
